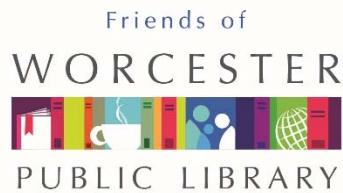

Worcester, MA – Every fall, the Friends of the Worcester Public Library host a book sale for adults, children, families, students, and book lovers. Hundreds of new and used books and media are available at steep discounts.

This year, the Friends of the Worcester Public Library will host its semi-annual book sale on Friday and Saturday, November 3 & 4, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Saxe Room at the Main Library.



The sale will feature all types of books, including fiction, non-fiction, biographies, children's books, hard cover, trade books, paperbacks, and CDs. Prices range from \$0.50 to \$2.00 with book sets for \$5.00. Children's hard cover books will be \$1.00 per book or 10 books for \$5.00. The Food for Thought Bookstore and Café will also be open during the sale. All proceeds support programs at the Worcester Public Library.
