Worcester Public Library Joins More than 60 Massachusetts Libraries to Bring 50+ Job Seekers Networking Group to the Public

For those aged 50 and over who are seeking employment.

Worcester, MA – The Worcester Public Library (WPL) will be joining more than 60 Massachusetts public libraries in sponsoring The Massachusetts Library Collaborative's 50+ Job Seekers Group. People who are seeking employment and are aged fifty or older are invited to join this online program, and benefit from free biweekly skill-building and networking opportunities. Attendance at every session is not required, but highly recommended.

Each meeting features a new topic and includes a presentation by certified master career coach Debbi Hope, MBA. The meetings will also include a hands-on workshop on topics relevant to career transition, special guest speakers, direct access to hiring managers, small group breakout rooms, and one-on-one coaching guidance.

The networking group will meet via Zoom on Wednesdays, from January through June. There are two sessions offered, a morning session on the first and third Wednesdays of the month from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m., and an evening session on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month from 6 to 8 p.m. Job seekers may join at any time, and may attend one or more meetings. The sessions will not be recorded.
