


# **Fiction**


# The Apollo Murders by Chris Hadfield

# Cloud Cuckoo Land by Anthony Doerr



Part H Is for Hawk, part The Soul of an Octopus, this book is both a meditation on the world's most elusive fish - the eel - and a reflection on the human condition.




#### From Here to Eternity: Traveling the World to Find the Good Death by Caitlin Doughty

An Emmy Award-winning writer and activist describes the years she spent in early adulthood fighting leukemia and how she learned to live again.




## Black Food: Stories, Art & Recipes from Across the African Diaspora by Bryant Terry


#### Nowhere Girl: A Memoir of a Fugitive Childhood by Cheryl Diamond

#### Smithsonian Micro Life: Miracles of the Miniature World Revealed by Derek Harvey, et al.


This beautiful book magnifies and explores the miracles of the microscopic world around us. Perfect for people who enjoy photography, nature and biology.
